So smile the next time I see you.

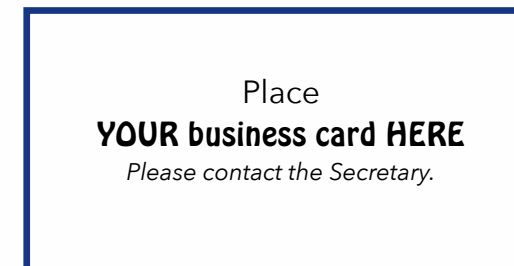
