

Brothers,


It is that time of year again. Notices will be sent out soon reminding you of your 2025 dues payment. The preferred payment method is to send a check to the Lodge.

This year, Grand Lodge is making some changes as we embrace the digital era. Paper dues cards will no longer be sent out by default. Instead, we will be relying on the digital dues card found inside of Grand View. Please take some time to create a Grand View account if you have not already done so. If you already have an account, please take some time to ensure your contact information is up to date. Our Lodge pulls all of our information for mail correspondence from Grand View, and it is your responsibility to ensure the information is accurate.

Step 1: Go to azmasons.org and click the blue button that says "Login to Grandview"



Step 2: Sign in or Sign Up. If signing up, you will need your Member ID, which can be located on a previous dues card.

Step 3 and 4: Verify contact information in "My Profile" and find your dues card in "Virtual Card"


